

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITY CODE

All students in Colonel Crawford Intermediate and High School who participate in extra-curricular or co-curricular activities will adhere to the following code of conduct. Violations incurred while in intermediate school will not carry over to the high school – each student will begin his/her high school experience with no violations.

Offenses:

1. No use and/or possession of tobacco in any form.
2. No stealing or destruction of property – public or private.
3. No selling, supplying, transmitting, possessing, or use of alcohol, illegal drugs, non-prescribed drugs or look-alike drugs.
4. No convictions on criminal or civil charges other than traffic violations.
5. No serious violations of the “Student Code of Conduct”.
6. No serious unsportsmanlike conduct or blatant disrespect for school rules.

First Offense- Voluntary Compliance

If a student within 24 hours of an offense occurring, voluntarily turns him/herself in to the building principal, athletic director/activities director, or coach/advisor, the student is suspended from that sport/activity for 10% of the regular season’s contests after a hearing with the athletic director/activity director. The participant may still practice during the suspension. An offense which occurs on a weekend or when school is not in session does not remove the 24 hour time requirement, but circumstances will be considered. The voluntary compliance is not applicable when the athlete is caught in violation by a law enforcement official. He/She may attend the game(s), but not dress.

First Offense- Involuntary Compliance

The participant will be suspended from extra-curricular and co-curricular activities for 20% of the regular season’s contests after a hearing with the athletic director/activity director. The participant may still practice during the suspension. He/She may attend the game(s), but not dress.

Second Offense- Voluntary or Involuntary Compliance

The participant will be suspended from extra-curricular and co-curricular activities for 40% of the regular season’s contests after a hearing with the athletic director/activity director. The participant may still practice during the suspension. He/She may attend the game(s), but not dress.

Third Offense- Voluntary or Involuntary Compliance

The participant will be suspended from all extra-curricular and co-curricular activities for one year from the date of the third offense, after a hearing with the athletic director/activity director.

Fourth Offense- Voluntary or Involuntary Compliance

The student will be banned from participating in any Colonel Crawford extra-curricular or co-curricular activities for the remainder of that student's high school career after a hearing with the athletic director/activity director.

Additional Consequences/Requirements

Any coach/advisor to any activity has the right to suspend any student from a given activity for up to seven calendar days. Students will be expected to be in compliance with the Activity Code during the entire calendar year and summer violations of this code will be enforced during the summer months.

Reinstatement/Review Board

In the cases of all of the offenses above, except the fourth offense, the student may request in writing a review after the period of suspension expires. In the case of Offense #3 (use of alcohol or other drugs), the following conditions must be met to be granted reinstatement:

1. The participant proceeds to be evaluated by a chemical dependency professional.
2. The participant agrees to follow the appropriate treatment outlined.
3. The principal receives written notification by the chemical dependency professional on the course of action outlined.

The Activities Review Board will consist of the building principal, athletic director/activity director, and one faculty member from grades 7-12, appointed by the building principal.

Notification of Suspension

Parents will receive written notification of a suspension in writing detailing the length of the suspension, the reasons for the suspension, and the appeals procedures.

Appeals:

Appeals of suspensions resulting from Activity Code violations may be made to the Superintendent in writing within 10 calendar days of receipt of notification of the suspension. Appeals of the Superintendent's decision may be made to the Board of Education within 10 calendar days of receipt of notification of the Superintendent's decision. **The Board of Education decision will stand as final.**
